Funding Call for NIHR Three Schools' Dementia Research Programme

NIHR Three Research Schools Prevention research programme - Pre and Post-Doctoral Fellowships and Career Development Awards

The NIHR Three Research Schools Prevention research programme is inviting applications for Pre and Post-Doctoral Fellowships and Career Development Awards. Applications should be co-developed with members of at least two of the Three Research Schools (Public Health, Primary Care, and Social Care Research). Fellowships are to start no earlier than January 2025 and Career Development Awards no later than April 2025. Awards will only be made to NIHR Three School Member Institutions. Applications should be submitted by **17:00 on Friday, 13th September 2024.**

NIHR Bursaries

Regulated Health and Care Professionals can apply for NIHR bursaries to pay the course fees to undertake master's level courses aligned with the Clinician Researcher Credentials Framework. The qualifications are for experienced healthcare practitioners who want to take on leadership roles in clinical research delivery, such as Co-Investigator or Principal Investigator.

These bursaries are part of a wider HCP funding program which has ten streams of work to develop careers within specific professions. Consequently, the bursaries are not available for some professions including doctors, dentists and clinical research practitioners. NIHR recognise the impact this has on many colleagues who have a desire to undertake these courses and we are continuing to work with the Department of Health and Social Care in trying to address this. This restriction applies only to bursary and not course applications; all professions are eligible to apply for a place on one of the courses. If you do not meet the eligibility criteria for the Regulated Health and Care Professionals bursaries, you can visit the Clinician Researcher Credentials funding information page to see what other funding is available. If there are any updates about bursaries for other professions NIHR will email people registered for updates to inform them of this. You can register for updates by completing this form.
